POSITION TITLE:

4-H Livestock Judging Coach

TIME REQUIRED:

6 hours per month including yearly between February and August; judging events approximately four (4) days; judging clinics and practices twice monthly for two (2) hours per meeting during February through August

LOCATION:

Countywide with events in Lexington and also the area contest

GENERAL PURPOSE:

- Serve as a coach and teacher for youth interested in livestock
- Serve as liaison between the Extension office and the youth and parents involved
- Encourage active participation in practices and competitive judging events
- Encourage livestock judging ethics and adherence to 4-H judging competition rules

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Teach young people breed characteristics of beef, swine and sheep
- Educate youth on judging criteria to be used in comparing animals
- Coordinate livestock judging practices with hands-on judging experiences
- Register youth for competitions through 4-H agent
- Inform 4-H agent of involvement and participation in judging practices and events
- Follow all 4-H rules and regulations
- Attend local, area, and state judging competitions in which local youth are participating
- At the end of each judging season, evaluate the livestock judging program
- Recruit youth and leaders to participate and assist with livestock judging program

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must complete the Volunteer Application process and be approved by the Youth Protection/Risk Management Committee.
- An interest in the growth and development of young people
- A livestock background and interest
- A willingness to learn 4-H judging criteria and rules and regulations

- Develop friendships with youth and adults statewide
- · Gain knowledge and skills in livestock judging
- Networking with other coaches and participate across the state and nation
