GENERAL PURPOSE:

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Be committed to young people and their development in all areas
- Assist club members in all 4-H cooking projects and related areas
- Be aware of cooking projects available and help individual members select appropriate projects
- Plan a program of cooking activities, including meeting dates, times, and locations
- Demonstrate proper cooking techniques to all members
- Plan a one hour educational cooking program each week.
- Assist members with selection of appropriate cooking supplies
- Make sure members are progressing with their cooking project
- Advise the 4-H professional regarding members project completion or progress
- Advise members of opportunities to showcase their completed cooking projects including dates, locations, and requirements
- Encourage parent's participation and support of 4-H meetings and activities
- Participate in one or more volunteer development opportunities throughout the year
- Continually provide positive feedback to members
- Follow all 4-H guidelines and policies of the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service, the Kentucky 4-H program, and the county 4-H program

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must complete the Volunteer Application process and be approved by the Youth Protection/Risk Management Committee.
- Knowledge of basic cooking techniques
- Ability to organize information and materials
- Ability to work with minimal supervision from professional staff
- Ability to educate and motivate youth while nurturing positive self-esteem, decision making, responsibility and leadership in youth
- A willingness to become familiar with and work with the philosophy and guidelines of the University of Kentucky CES, Kentucky 4-H program and county 4-H program

BENEFITS:

- Appropriate manuals, pamphlets, audio visual aids, newsletters and other resource material will be provided
- Professionals will be available to consult with volunteers on a one to one basis
- Recognition and awards will be given to volunteers
- Opportunity to work with youth and provide support and growth experiences
