POSITION TITLE:

Country Ham Project Leader

TIME REQUIRED / DURATION OF APPOINTMENT:

- 5 meetings for 1 hour
- January through September.
- 3 hours planning and preparation time

LOCATION:

GENERAL PURPOSE:

Teach specific skills to 4-H members as outlined in the 4-H country ham project material. Advise members and parents about opportunities to showcase their completed projects (such as County and State Fair exhibits, etc.) including dates, locations and requirements

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Pick up project material from the County Extension Office
- Distribute material to members of project group
- Assist members in selecting required materials for project completion
- Advise the 4-H professional of the members' progress
- Participate in volunteer development opportunities
- Follow all guidelines and policies of the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service, the Kentucky 4-H program and the county 4-H program
- Encourage parental participation and support
- · Ability to organize information and materials
- Provide positive feedback to members

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must complete the Kentucky 4-H Volunteer Application and screening process and Complete the Livestock Volunteer certification
- Provide own transportation to meetings and activities
- Effective communication skills
- Ability to work with minimal supervision from professional staff
- A sincere interest in working with extension staff, volunteers, parents and youth
- Organization skills: ability to organize information and materials in a timely manner

- Ability to educate youth while nurturing positive self esteem, decision making, responsibility and leadership in youth
- A willingness to become familiar and work with the philosophy, guidelines and rules of the University of Kentucky CES, Kentucky 4-H Youth Development Program and the county 4-H program
