POSITION TITLE:

Community Arts Council Member

TIME REQUIRED:

- Quarterly meetings (2-3 hours each)
- Optional support for community engagement events
- See local Community Arts Extension Council by-laws for term duration

LOCATION:

County Extension Office, virtual meetings, or rotating community sites

GENERAL PURPOSE:

Serve in an advisory capacity to help Extension staff shape arts programming that reflects community priorities. Council Members provide insight, identify opportunities, and strengthen partnerships that support sustainable community arts initiatives.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Attend and actively participate in quarterly council meetings
- Provide feedback on current and proposed arts programs
- Help identify community partners and collaboration opportunities
- Promote arts activities through local networks
- Represent the population and values of the broader community
- Respect confidentiality and open dialogue within the council
- Follow the policies and civil rights expectations of Extension

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Applicants must complete volunteer application and screening process
- Provide own transportation to meetings and activities
- Interest in arts, culture, and community well-being
- Commitment to expanding access to the arts in local community
- Ability to work collaboratively with Extension staff and other council members
- Willingness to provide constructive and honest dialogue
- Willingness to serve as an ambassador for Community Arts Extension program

• Council members are expected to attend meetings and contribute meaningfully. If a member misses multiple meetings or becomes inactive, Extension staff may invite a new representative to maintain momentum and consistency in input.

- Help shape arts programming to reflect local culture, values, and community priorities
- Build connections with leaders across arts, education, local government, and nonprofits
- Receive recognition for service at volunteer appreciation events and in Extension communications
- Contribute your experience, ideas, and insights to guide long-term planning and impact

- Strengthen civic engagement and support public decision-making
- Enhance your leadership profile through active involvement with a respected public institution
- Improve community outcomes through your influence on creative placemaking and arts access
- Orientation and support provided by Extension professionals
