Volunteer Position Description

Community Arts Volunteer Project Leader Cooperative Extension Service University of Kentucky

POSITION TITLE:

Community Arts Volunteer Project Leader

TIME REQUIRED:

- 5-10 hours per month, depending on project scope
- Typical duration: 6-12 months
- Includes planning time, communications with Extension Staff, and facilitation of activities

LOCATION:

Extension offices, community centers, public art sites, schools or other community locations such as Senior Citizens center, Health Department or Library. Depending on project, additional planning time may be necessary at home.

GENERAL PURPOSE:

Support the design, delivery, and evaluation of arts programs that enhance creative learning, place-making, and community pride. Community Arts Volunteers may facilitate workshops, lead public art activities, or manage multi-week programs.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Collaborate with Extension agent to plan project timelines and logistics
- Lead or co-facilitate community arts activities (e.g., painting, fiber arts, performance, crafts)
- Maintain a welcoming and inclusive environment for participants
- Ensure setup and cleanup of supplies and materials
- Communicate with Extension staff about participant attendance, feedback, and supply needs
- Participate in evaluation efforts (e.g., surveys, feedback forms)
- Follow all Extension policies, especially youth protection and safety guidelines
- Notify agent promptly of any challenges or schedule changes

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Applicants must complete volunteer application/screening process
- Provide own transportation to meetings and activities
- Background or strong interest in arts and creative community development
- Experience leading activities for groups or willingness to be trained
- Effective communication skills with Extension staff, volunteers, and program participants
- A sincere interest in working with Extension staff, volunteers, parents, and youth

- The opportunity to work with youth and/or adults, providing positive support and growth experiences
- Receive intrinsic and extrinsic rewards at volunteer recognition events
- Volunteer development opportunities •
- Opportunities to share your skills, talents and interests •
- Orientation provided by Extension staff •
- Research shows that volunteering promotes improved health
- Opportunity to make a difference in the life of a youth or adult
- Use office supplies and materials •
- Extension professionals will be available for consultation
